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PILGRIM 1: So, if you have a friend or relative not interested, even so you should entice them even just to go anyway even if they not interested?

ERUCH: Don't entice them; who is going to entice? Why do you want to go out of your way to entice them?

PILGRIM 1: No your relatives, maybe you love or something, if they come, "Any way let's do the meeting, let's do..."

ERUCH: Most important is that you should not have that intention, all that you have to do is to be natural you see, so when your love reaches that height, that when you speak you speak only about Him or you bring Him in your conversation every now and then, in a most natural way. Don't go with... "Aaah you must hear, he should hear, she should hear,"

That will retard the progress you see of your intention. Be natural whether he hears or not what have you to do? In your talk on anything, suppose if your friends come here—we'll talk... socialize yourself and this and that and then, but when your love, and your sanskaras are such that you revolve around like a moth you see around the light. Naturally you bring in the light itself all the time you see and there the impact is there on those people whom, with whom you are socializing, it's but natural. But don't go out of your way to specially tell them or anything such that that's what Baba *doesn't want us to do*. Be very natural you see, but then your love itself will revolve around Him and that will go to them.

PILGRIM 2: I had a dream once on that theme... it was very amusing,

ERUCH: Ok. what was the dream

PILGRIM 2: At the time I was living with a man, who wasn't a Baba lover. And I had spent the first two years of our relationship nagging him nearly to death about Baba, and at this point I had a dream that Michael and I were standing in front of Baba and Baba was sitting in this chair, and I thought oh isn't this nice. Baba going to marry us, instead Baba leaned forward and pointed his finger at me and it got that finger got bigger and bigger. He said in a huge booming voice, "Mind your

own business!” And I woke up, I was just laughing. I thought—well two messages. One is leave this man alone, his relationship with God is between him and God and other end is, for the last two years I have been nagging him about Baba, and you, I wasn’t, taking care of your own relationship with Baba.
